His family moved from Verona, Italy, to Brazil where Valmor was born. Later, they returned to Italy. When he was thirteen years old, he discovered his vocation to be a priest and eventually, after studying in America and Europe, he graduated in Philosophy and Theology. In 2003 Valmor was ordained as priest. He has lived in the UK for the past ten years and is a British citizen.

In March 2024, two months after his marriage to Thais, Valmor Alves Pimenta became vicar of the Meridian Benefice.
